## **Pupil (personal) development, behaviour and welfare/SMSC**

### **Safety and Behaviour:**

We are 5 weeks in to the school term and it has been a very active but rewarding start for all .

As ever MAPA will be reported on in detail by Mrs Birch; but the use of physical intervention remains absolutely minimal.

It is clear from scrutiny of the data that established pupils continue to feel safe and supported by the calm and directive presence of staff. Pupils who are new to the school and often come through a set of experiences that are stressful and are yet to establish the type of rapport with staff that is invaluable in helping them understand resilience in themselves and how adults can help them.

Attendance will be reported on in full by Mr Hilditch as will the PASS survey, to take place next week.

Safeguarding, CIN and related issues will be reported on as part 2.

### **Personal Development:**

Representatives from the school council continue to attend the CWAC 'School Champions' meeting that was hosted by Dorin Park.

You will recall they were to be consulted on;

- Preparing for the Special Education Needs and Disability (SEND) Ofsted inspection
- Cheshire West and Chester SEND Strategy
- Consultation on 0-19 services and children's centres
- Local Offer

The above areas were differentiated for the young people who attended and our representative felt that it was very worthwhile, feeling involved in the developments around them.

Outdoor pursuits activities have been attended positively – pupils are developing skills of peer mentoring and positive interaction whilst responding to a physical activity deigned to ensure that they can keep themselves safe. This term water activities are in place – at the Docks in Liverpool, Kayaking.

Year 11 work placements have all been procured, this is an essential part of our pupil's development and these placements are tailored to their needs.

Pupils will be encouraged to participate in the forthcoming Autumn school fair – whether that is to make items to sell, to help or to attend. We have also again run a successful Charity event for Cancer research and out thanks are recorded to Mrs Boole for organising this.

One pupil is presently positively engaging with a reintegration to a local mainstream school.

### SMSC/Britishness:

In the school corridor after consulting with pupils, training staff and involving parents a Hate Crime display is in a prominent position on the main corridor.

Assemblies have already taken place and the next Learn fest day is before Xmas to celebrate diversity in religious culture.
