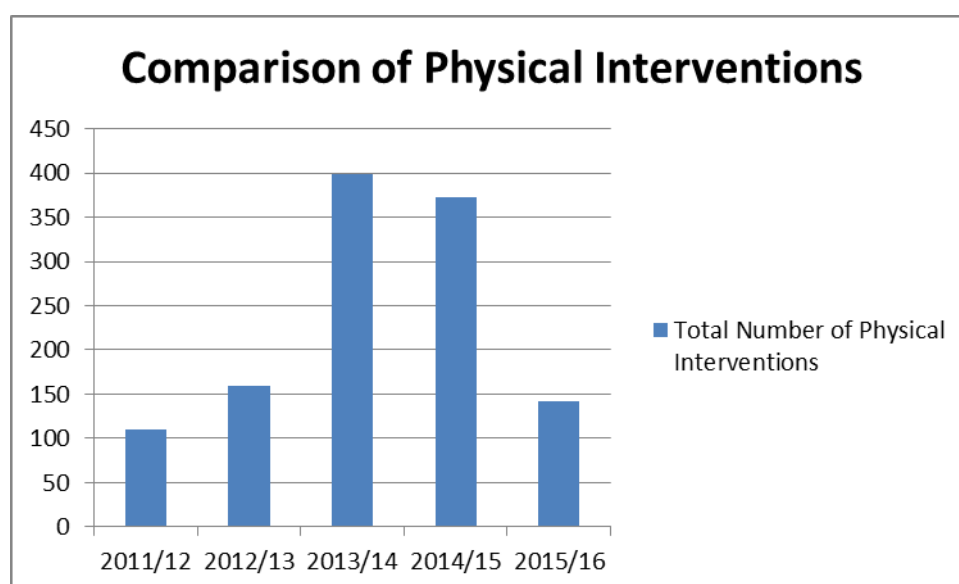


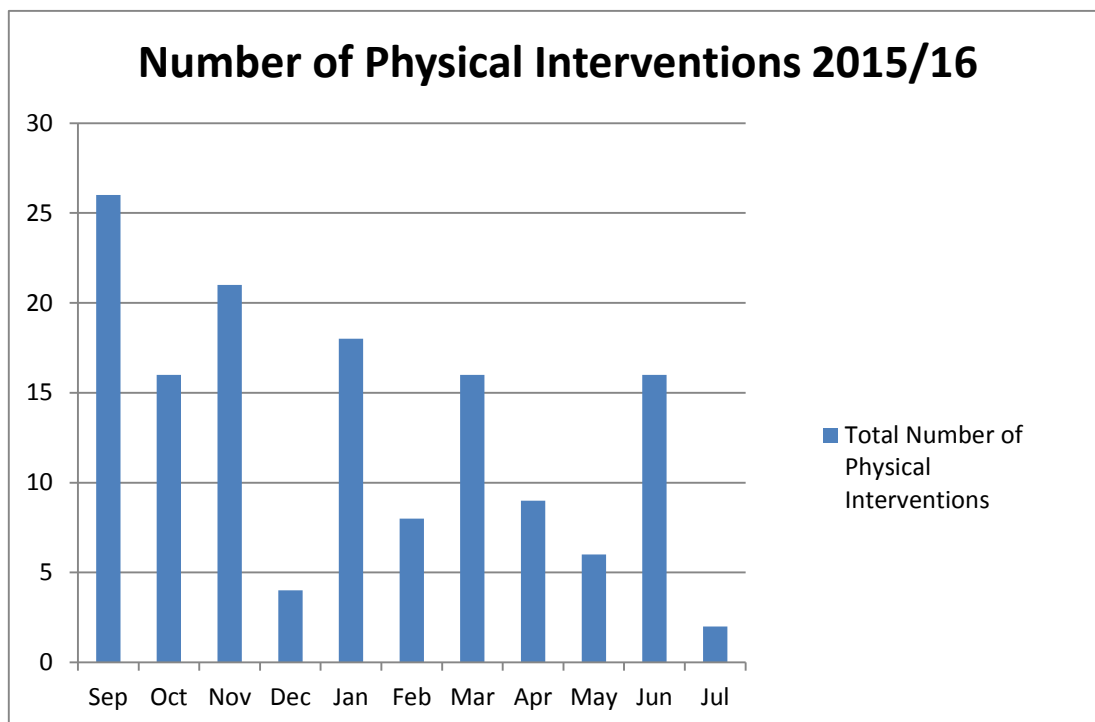
MAPA Update Sep 16

- Management of Actual & Potential Aggression (MAPA) training is fully implanted in the school, with most staff trained.
- A 2 day training programme was delivered for 3 staff from Greenbank school and 2 staff from Archers Brook. (Other new staff will be trained during the Autumn Term)
- Advanced skills and Emergency holding skills - we will look into the benefits of this training and if it is appropriate for our setting now.
- Refresher training during the Summer Term was successful.
- Greenbank school have requested that I deliver refresher training for their staff in January 2017.
- Residential staff were successful in completing their refresher training in September 2016.
- Any new staff will complete the full 2 days training during the Autumn Term.
- I will complete refresher training for my instructor certificate during the Autumn Term.

The total numbers of physical interventions decreased by 62% for 2015/16 compared to 2014/15, which is excellent. We have the lowest recorded interventions since 2011/12.



The new techniques that staff use are less restrictive and less intrusive, this has had an impact on the number of restraints and the duration that pupils are held. Staff make excellent use of verbal and non-verbal interventions to decelerate incidents and therefore reduce the need to physically intervene.



The data for the year 2014/16 indicate a decline in incidents during those months that we have a holiday, e.g. Dec, Feb, Apr, May & Jul

We will continue to use separate books to record incidents for each year group, Key Stage 2 and The House. The Link pupils will now be included with their own year group, following the successful integration of Link pupils into the main school. The format of the books has been updated in line with MAPA language and includes a small section to record the pupils' voice.

Ian Dean will assist in helping to ensure that the recording of pupils' views is more consistent, this will enable us to further improve our postvention care.

Ian Dean will assist in ensuring our positive handling policy is accurate to ensure the National Care Guidelines are met.

There are new guidelines regarding restraints which will be included in our policy once CPI have renewed their training schedule, which will happen over the course of this year.

I can include further comparisons of year groups and individuals when requested. All data is kept on the R-Drive in MAPA folder and all log books for recording incidents are kept in the staff room.
