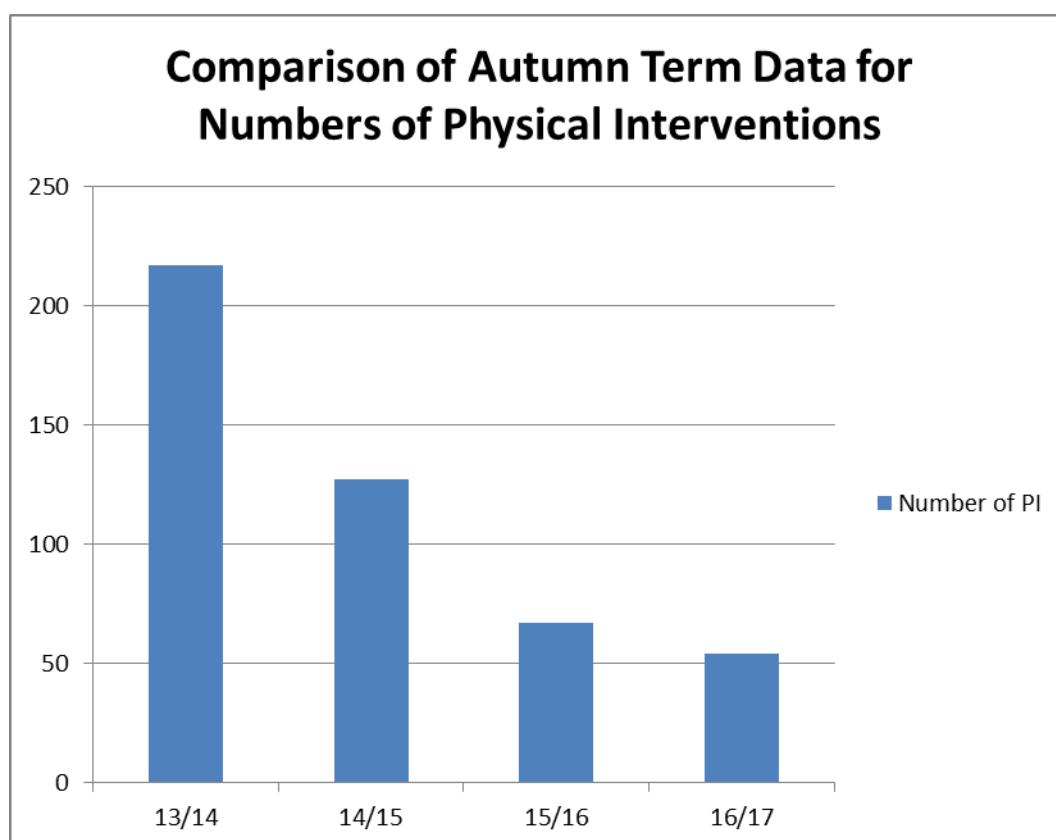


MAPA Update Jan 17

- Management of Actual & Potential Aggression (MAPA) training is fully implanted in the school, with most staff trained.
- A 1 day refresher training programme was successfully delivered for all staff at Greenbank school in January
- Greenbank school have requested that I deliver refresher training for their staff in January 2018.
- New staff from Archers Brook and Greenbank School were successful in completing full training in December 2016.
- Any new staff will complete the full 2 days training during the Spring Term.
- I have completed the refresher training for my instructor certificate.
- Advanced skills and Emergency holding skills - we will look into the benefits of this training and if it is appropriate for our setting now.

The total numbers of physical interventions decreased again in the Autumn Term, when we compare the data from previous years. There has been a decrease of 20% from last year's data and a decrease of 75% from 13/14



Staff make excellent use of verbal and non-verbal interventions to decelerate incidents and therefore reduce the need to physically intervene and MAPA holds are less restrictive for pupils which helps to reduce the time that pupils are held for

We will continue to use separate books to record incidents for each year group, Key Stage 2 and The House. The Link pupils are now included within their own year group, following the successful integration of Link pupils into the main school.

Ian Dean will assist in helping to ensure that the recording of pupils' views is more consistent, this will enable us to further improve our postvention care.
